

## Exercise 5

Binary-Coded Decimal (BCD) is a representation of the decimal digits 0 to 9, using their binary coded equivalent. In this representation, 0 would be 0000, and 9 would be 1001.

A seven-segment display (SSD) is a set of LEDs that displays a numerical digit (common in digital watches, calculators and clock radios). The display has seven outputs (a, b, c, d, e, f, g), as shown below.



A BCD-to-SSD decoder converts a set of four inputs (x1, x2, x3, x4) to a seven-segment output (a, b, c, d, e, f, g).

- (1) Provide the truth table.
- (2) Draw a circuit diagram for a decoder.
